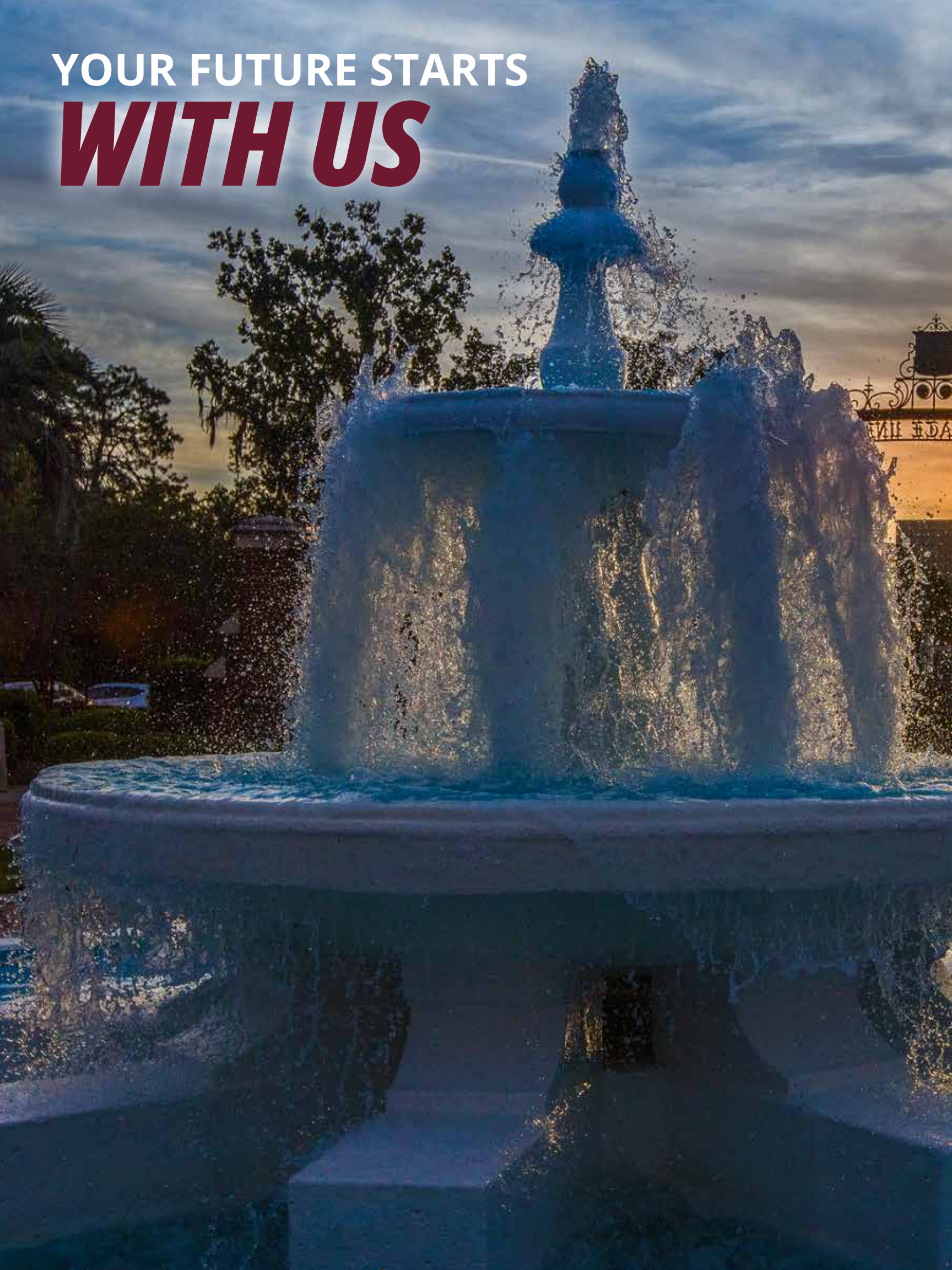

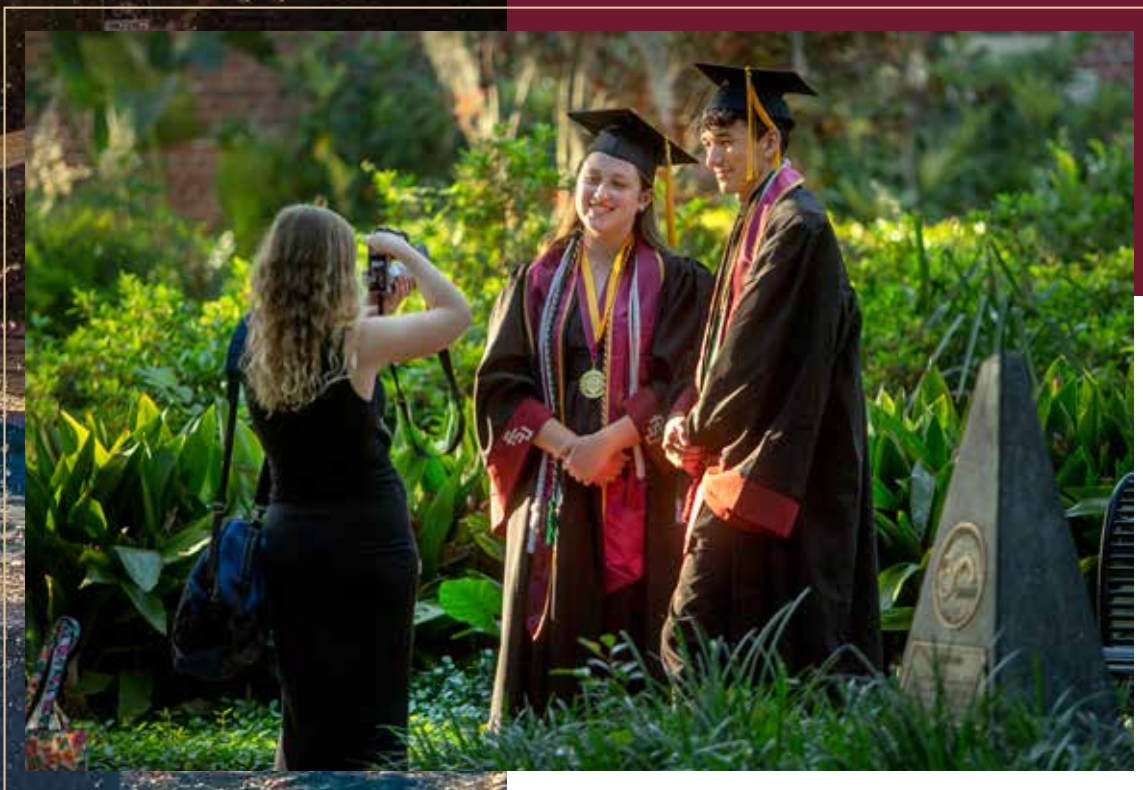

# BUILT ON *TRADITION*

Florida State University holds the distinction of being the oldest higher education site in Florida. While its origins date back to the 1820's, it was officially chartered in 1851. Initially known as the West Florida Seminary, the institution was established on the historic hill where the Westcott Building is located. By 1897, it had evolved into the state's first liberal arts college.

In 1905, the West Florida Seminary became an all-women's college and was renamed "Florida State College for Women." By the 1930's, it was the third largest women's college in the nation. In 1947, as soldiers returned from WWII, the Florida Legislature made the institution coeducational and renamed it to "Florida State University."

A new school seal featuring three torches - Vires, Artes, Mores, which translates to Strength, Skill, Character - was created to signify the passing down of knowledge to future generations.

In each succeeding decade, Florida State University has grown in both size and impact. FSU continues to gain prominence as a preeminent research university that is dedicated to student success through excellence in teaching, research, creative endeavors, and service opportunities.

The name was selected specifically to **honor the indomitable bravery, strength, and spirit** of the Seminole Tribe of Florida. For more than seven decades, FSU has worked closely with the Seminole

Tribe of Florida to ensure the dignity and propriety of the various Seminole symbols used by the university. FSU aspires to be a model community that treats all cultures with respect while celebrating the Unconquered Spirit of the Seminole Tribe.

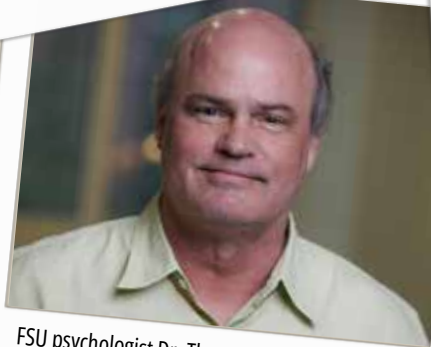

# ACADEMIC *OPPORTUNITIES*

## DEGREE IN THREE

This program gives students the opportunity to graduate with a bachelor's degree in three years or less. Degree in Three is typically a best fit for students who enter FSU with college credit earned through AP, IB, AICE, or dual enrollment. ## MORE IN FOUR

Under this option, students can graduate with their bachelor's degree in three years and then move into one of FSU's 120+ master's or graduate certificate programs. Some master's degrees can be completed within one year, so More in Four participants may graduate in four years with bachelor's and master's degrees. ## 50+ COMBINED BACHELOR'S/ MASTER'S PROGRAMS

Over 50 Combined Bachelor's/Master's Pathways provide academically talented undergraduate students an opportunity to complete both a bachelor's and a master's degree. Upon approval, a Combined Bachelor's/Master's Pathway allows for up to 12 graduate hours to be shared with or double-counted toward an undergraduate degree program. A student enrolled in a combined pathway will earn the bachelor's degree upon completion of the undergraduate program and master's degree upon completion of the graduate program.

Qualified students interested in pursuing a Combined Bachelor's/Master's Pathway should contact the respective department/unit associated with the pathway for more information regarding specific admissions criteria and program requirements. FSU students normally apply to participate in a combined bachelor's/master's pathway in their junior or senior year as an undergraduate, but may apply as early as the second semester of their sophomore year. ## FSU HEALTH: REVOLUTIONIZING HEALTHCARE AND TRANSFORMING EDUCATION

FSU's College of Medicine is committed to training primary care physicians who will help to serve underserved populations. To expand the reach of our medical faculty, staff, and students, FSU Health, which is an ambitious initiative in North Florida, aims to revolutionize the state of healthcare in this region. The Florida Legislature awarded FSU with \$125 million to build an academic health center. FSU President Richard McCullough stated, "FSU Health will transform patient care, education, and research across the state."

Located on the Tallahassee Memorial Hospital campus, FSU Health will cultivate partnerships with other health systems across the region, including HCA Florida Capital Hospital, St. Joe, Tallahassee Orthopedic Clinic, and the Mayo Clinic. Stacey Patterson, FSU's Vice President of Research, says "The FSU Health initiative can create better care options while also creating jobs, educational opportunities, and a major expansion of research and development in the region." The Institute for Strategic Partnerships, Innovation, Research, and Education (InSPIRE), a new initiative highlighting the opportunity for FSU to support advanced materials for aerospace and hypersonic research was approved by the Triumph Gulf Coast Board. InSPIRE has been awarded \$98.4 million, the largest grant amount in the board's history. With the aerospace industry already located in the Florida panhandle, InSPIRE will be building facilities near the Northwest Florida Beaches, an area not too far from our Tallahassee and Panama City campuses.
